

PINEHURST RESORT | NO. 2

Get ready for a tee party! The "pounding heart of Pinehurst Resort," and the site of the first U.S. Open Anchor—boasting the most golf championships countrywide—means these greens are just begging to be played. A Donald Ross masterpiece, the evergreen paradise emphasizes a well-rounded unique vibe and a legacy lineup of golf pros who've graced the fairway—think Arnold Palmer and "Tiger Tiger Woods, y'all." PINE NEEDLES

A legend in its own right—one of a pine, if you will—this top-five NC course (and Golfweek's top 25 in the U.S.!) famously bought and restored by LPGA icon Peggy Kirk Bell and husband Warren "Bullet" Bell remains in the fam to this day.
